BUILDING COMMUNITIES RECOGNITION PROGRAM

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OBJECTIVE

The Leading Women Building Communities Recognition Program acknowledges and celebrates women who demonstrate exceptional leadership in working to improve the lives of others in their communities.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Nominees must be female and 18 years of age or older at the time of nomination and have not received this award in the past. Nominees who have received a Leading Girls Award may be nominated for the Leading Women Award if they have different accomplishments.

Nominees must have demonstrated exceptional community leadership to improve the lives of others and have made substantial contributions through volunteer work.

Nominees must have worked to improve the lives of others in one of the following ways:

- 1. Fostering and supporting the participation of women from diverse cultural communities in social and economic community life.
- 2. Taking initiative to foster communities where women and children can live free from violence.
- 3. Promoting women's and girls' health and well-being through education, community service and/or research.
- 4. Providing young women with mentoring, guidance, coaching and opportunities for self improvement.

- 5. Supporting women's participation in their chosen field or endeavouring to remove barriers in the workplace or field of work.
- 6. Encouraging women to participate in any part of public service.

NOMINATION INSTRUCTIONS

All submissions must meet the eligibility criteria.

- 1. Complete Section A: Basic Information on attached nomination form, including
 - a. Nominee information
 - b. MPP information
- 2. Prepare documents for *Section B: Supporting Documents* and attach to nomination form, including
 - a. Three (3) Letters of Support: the letters must be unique to each nominee and must indicate how the nominee's work has improved the lives of others. Letters may be submitted by a community leader, mentor, employer, or another individual who has experience volunteering with the nominee. Letters of support from family members are not accepted.
 - b. Three (3) About the Nominee short answer questions (250 words each)

Forward nomination forms and the attached supporting documents to your local MPP.

The closing date for MPPs to sumbit nominations is January 24, 2014.
