### 2. Seeking witnesses to collision

The Ottawa Police Service Collision Investigation Unit is investigating a collision that occurred in the Hampton Park Plaza parking lot near Carling Avenue on Tuesday, February 2, 2016 at approximately 2:30pm.

Ottawa Police and Ottawa Paramedic attended the Hampton Park Plaza parking lot following a collision between a pedestrian and a vehicle. The 73 year old male pedestrian sustained life threatening injuries and remains in hospital. The driver did not sustain any injuries.

Collision investigators are asking witnesses to contact them.

### **3. Suspicious male**

The Ottawa Police Service Sexual Assault and Child Abuse (SACA) Section is investigating two reported incidents of a suspicious male attempting to lure teenage girls into a vehicle.

On December 5, 2015 the Ottawa Police received a third party report alleging that a child luring and sexual assault occurred in the area of Grove Avenue and Leonard Avenue on November 30, 2015 between the hours 7:45pm and 9:00pm involving a 15 year old girl. The victim is not providing further information to police, at this time.

The suspect male is described as a Caucasian male, 40-50 years old, slim build with short grey hair. He was wearing a t-shirt. The vehicle is described as a black pick-up truck.

## 2. On recherche des témoins d'une collision

L'Unité des enquêtes sur les collisions du Service de police d'Ottawa se penche sur une collision survenue dans le parc de stationnement du centre commercial Hampton Park, aux abords de l'avenue Carling, le mardi 2 février 2016 vers 14 h 30.

La Police d'Ottawa et les ambulanciers se rendirent au parc de stationnement du centre commercial Hampton Park à la suite d'une collision entre un piéton et un véhicule. Le piéton, un homme âgé de 73 ans, aurait subi des blessures mettant sa vie en péril; il repose toujours à l'hôpital. Le conducteur du véhicule ne fut pas blessé.

Les enquêteurs-collisions demandent aux témoins de l'incident de bien vouloir communiquer avec eux.

Toute personne ayant des renseignements pertinents à cette affaire est priée de communiquer avec l'Unité des enquêtes sur les collisions du Service de police d'Ottawa en composant le 613-236-1222, poste 2481. OPS and By-Law services base their work on call statistics. The more calls that you make, the more neighbourhood services we receive. There are three steps to making the call:

#### **a) Deciding which number to phone.**

If you have an emergency or see a crime in progress, call 9-1-1. If your car was broken into or you need police to attend another non-urgent situation, please call the “other emergencies” number (613-230-6211). To report an incident after it occurred without police attending the scene, please call 613-236-1222 – ext. 7300. You can reach by-law services at 3-1-1.

#### **b) Getting a report number.**

When the dispatcher answers, it is a good idea to ask for a report number immediately. We've found that dispatchers sometimes hang up before we get to ask for a number or we forget. Asking for a report number right away solves these problems.

**c) Share your report number and incident.**

Please e-mail your report numbers and a brief description of the incident to your Block Captain (if you have one), or directly to us.

**Importance of Reporting Prostitution and Problem Addresses**

Neighbourhood Watch members can support the police by writing down and phoning in important information such as: vehicle descriptions and license plate numbers (specify Ontario or Quebec) of anyone soliciting prostitutes, descriptions of drug dealers and addresses of crack houses.
