



REPORT ON ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Annual Meeting was held on Wednesday, June 14, 1989. The theme of the meeting was environmental concerns. Ms. Catherine Smithe gave a presentation on the proper use of Blue Boxes in waste disposal. Ms. Virginia Salares discussed alternatives to chemicals in lawn care. Mr. Miles McElrone provided information on the proposed Centre for Disease Control in Tunney's Pasture and answered questions on the new centre. We have received a letter from Mr. McElrone indicating that the facility will be level three, i.e. no airborne diseases will be involved, that the incinerator would be of medium size and that there would be little or no increase in the total amount of material to be incinerated. However no information on current emissions and probable future emissions has been provided except to say that current incineration has been without incident. The letter states that there will be no net loss of parking space in the Pasture but does indicate that parking space may be disrupted during construction. Enforcement of the by-laws during this period may be the best way to solve the problem and we will pursue this matter with the city when the actual construction site and period are known. Please let members of the new executive know of your concerns in regard to this Disease Control Centre as we will be meeting with Health and Welfare shortly at which time we will express our desire for more information as to current and future emissions and the exact size of the proposed incinerator.
