
Garden Club

Supporting trees, green spaces in Champlain Park

Got a shovel? We could use you Sept. 17 and 18

Our neighbourhood trees offer the best option for maintaining a green canopy that cools the air, reduces the risk of flooding, and provides habit for the many birds in our backyards. This fall presents several opportunities to contribute:

Plant trees Sept 17-18.

The National Capital Commission and the Urban Forest and Green Spaces initiative chaired by Adrian Bradley have struck an agreement to foster a healthy forest north of Pontiac Avenue. In the spring, the NCC removed

buckthorn and felled dead trees that were possible hazards along pathways. You are invited to plant trees in these cleared spaces and support the gradual succession of the flora and fauna towards a mature forest. Join us in the forest from **9 a.m. to 4 p.m.** on Sept. 17 and 18. Bring a shovel and contact Daniel Buckles (613-807-8048, dbuckles@sympatico.ca) to let the team know what you can do.

 Assess tree health. Neighbourwoods is another community initiative to foster neighbourhood stewardship of trees in public and residential



resident Catherine Shearer coordinated a tree inventory and health assessment for the park and the school. Next for the inventory are the residential blocks on the north side of Clearview Avenue. Contact Catherine (metshag@gmail.com) to see how you can learn about tree identification and contribute to the inventory.

• Recover spaces. This spring, Eloise Holland (Patricia Ave) organized the "Little Woods" project at Patricia and Clearview. The small plot of land on the

northwest corner is a city-owned property now planted with young Bur Oak, Sugar Maple, Hackberry and White Pine seedlings.

• Contribute independently. Plant a native tree in an open front yard space on your property (spring and fall are best) or adopt and water any of the newly planted trees in the park, the schoolyard or the NCC forest. They will grow and help to recover the tree canopy so important to our neighbourhood.
