# Sir John A. Macdonald Winter Trail Celebration and Ski Festival

**Canada's Capital Region**—The <u>Dovercourt Recreation Association</u> invites the public and the media to a double feature news event on the <u>Sir John A. Macdonald Winter Trail</u> on **Sunday**, **January 28, 2018**, for a celebration of its second season and the launch of the first <u>SJAM Ski</u> <u>Festival</u>.

For a second full season, skiers, snowshoers, walkers and snow bikers have access to a 16kilometre multi-use winter trail along the Ottawa River Pathway. The winter trail connects the Canadian War Museum with parklands along the Sir John A. Macdonald Parkway corridor, all the way to Westboro Beach. This year, there is a new loop at Tunney's Pasture and a new access point at Champlain Park.
