On Oct. 5 more than 50 people removed a city block of pavement from Pontiac Street, between Cowley and Carleton.

To mangle Joni's famous words, they depaved a-once paradise and took out a parking lot!

The fence for that section is now also gone. New soil and grass will directly connect our park with the NCC green space, all the way to the river. A pedestrian/bike path remains along the north edge of the park and a winter ramp will bring the SJAM trail alongside the skating rink. The planters will remain. The effort was led by Coun. Jeff Leiper, with funds from parkland cash-in-lieu and a grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation. Energetic community volunteers dug up sections of pavement and hauled them to dumpsters. The block disappeared, block by block! The volunteers were organized by the Enviro Centre and the community association, with coffee from Bridgehead and bagels from the Ottawa Bagel Shop. Bravo on this historic achievement.
