Volunteer call-out for cool rink season

Fieldhouse change-rooms remain closed under health protocol

The contract to build and maintain the outdoor rink will be managed by the Champlain Park Community Association again this season. We'd like to thank Matt, Paul and Dan for their commitment to make it happen.

We had strong community support for rink maintenance last season, but we'll need all

the help we can get again this year. If interested in volunteering (especially students looking for community hours), please email Matt

at ChamplainParkRink@gmail.com.

The timing of our maintenance schedule is important in preserving the rink. For example, shovelling snow before a thaw or small, frequent clearings during a blizzard can drastically reduce closures. A large volunteer network will help maximize the number of skating days.

We hope to start building by mid-December. Typically, the base requires 10-15 cms of snow, followed by packing



and flooding, a process that can take about a week.

Given public health protocols around COVID, the association will not be providing public access to the Fieldhouse change rooms or supervised rink hours (including booked events). We will continue to monitor developments and possibly make changes as the

season progresses. We encourage rink users to review the city's <u>outdoor skating</u> guidelines.

Finally, some tips to help ensure a great season:

- 1) Respect others, including social distancing rules.
- 2) Try to leave the rink in better shape than you found it.
- 3) Please keep snow off the boards (One foot away or over is preferred).
 - 4) Have fun!

The lights go out at 11 p.m. each night. Check our website (closer to opening) for updates on booked events.

Newly-named Kichi Sibi winter trail preps for snow

We're hoping for another great season on the Kichi Sibi winter trail, now renamed from the Sir John A. Macdonald, or SJAM, winter trail.

It connects the Canadian War Museum and Mill Street Brew Pub with parklands along the SJAM Parkway to Westboro Beach, animating spaces often little-used in the winter.

Two tracks will be set, one for snowshoers, walkers and bikers and the other for cross-country skiers, supporting both classic and skate-style techniques. The walking track will follow the existing pathway. Serpentine loops will add distance to the ski track at the Selby Plains, Remic Rapids greenspaces, Champlain Woods and open lands adjacent to



the War Museum and Champlain Bridge, for an expected distance of 16 kilometres.

Amenities along the trail include the Westboro Beach tobogganing hill, the NCC Remic Rapids Bistro (the Nordic Village), the John Ceprano rock sculptures, the café at the War Museum and Mill Street Brew Pub.
