So, what does the association do? It works hard on many fronts to enhance and protect our community, under the guidance of an elected board of directors. (All volunteers!)

How will your \$20 be used? To support CPCA activities:

- * Coordinating events like theatre in the park, the Halloween Fun Run, star gazing, Winter Carnival, an online chess tournament and contests with prizes.
- * Coordinating the rink, and Fieldhouse activities.
- * Enhancing our natural green space (ski trails, pollinator garden, tree plantings).

- * Presenting on planning and zoning issues.
- * Supporting our community's concerns at City Hall.
- * Working with other communities on shared issues.
