Although the city has not earmarked funds for any Champlain Park projects, Kitchissippi has money in its Cash-In-Lieu of Parkland fund — money the ward receives from developers. **Coun. Jeff Leiper** oversees the fund, and has indicated a willingness to use some for projects in Champlain Park.

This survey is a preliminary outreach to gauge what new amenities most interest the community and will be available on the association website until **Dec. 6**.
